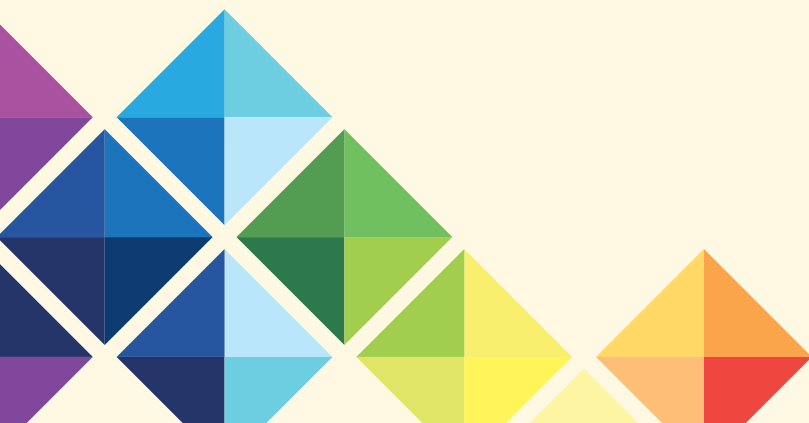

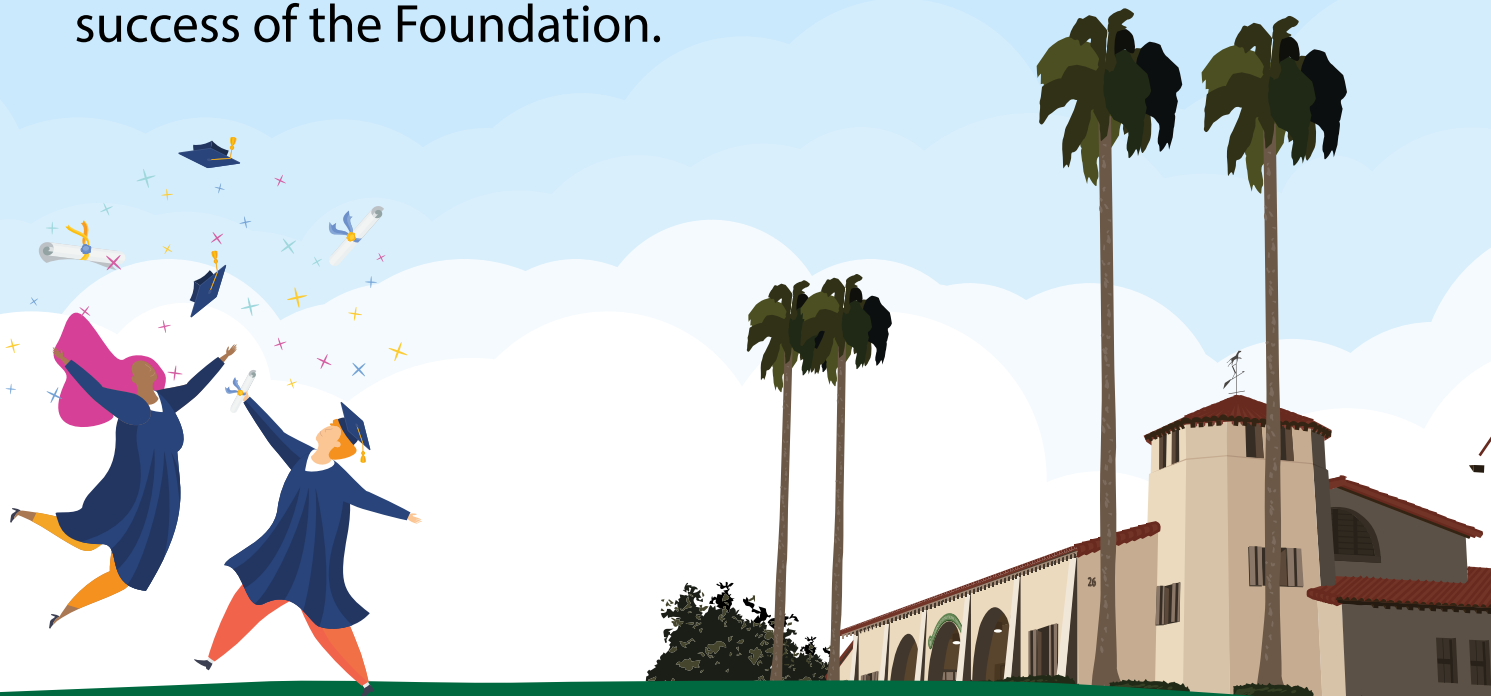

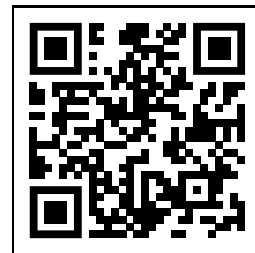

University Village Updates

Splash Into Summer Wellness Week

University Village recently held its annual “Wellness Week” on April 24-29, 2022. This year’s overall theme was “Splash into Summer,” with each day focusing on a different aspect of wellness (environmental, physical, occupational, emotional, social, and spiritual wellness). Wellness Week is an all-hands-on-deck event, with the University Village Residential Education (Res Ed) team hosting multiple programs every night. University Village staff was excited to get back to a mostly in-person series of programs!

The varied programming throughout the week catered to residents’ many interests. For example, during “Physical Wellness” night, programs included gentle yoga, meal prepping, and more! On “Emotional Wellness” night, residents enjoyed a relaxing Paint Night, a DIY spa station, and a program called “Golf Kartaoke,” where residents were picked up at the front gate and driven to their apartment if they sang karaoke!



The Village also partnered with campus and community partners, including Counseling and Psychological Services, the Career Center, and East Valley Community Health Center, who provided free HIV testing for residents.

Wellness Week was a great way for residents to connect and try new things while relaxing before the stress of finals week. One resident, Jessie Hertz, sent feedback about her experience at Wellness Week, stating, “With finals week coming up, the Village Wellness Week came at a perfect time to relax, unwind, and meet friends! I especially enjoyed painting on canvas with calming music and friends at the Paint Night program, which was very fun and relaxing. I loved looking forward each day to the new events offered throughout the week and a chance to participate in the relaxing programs focused on diverse aspects of wellness.”

Community Development Coordinator Ally LeClair, who helped coordinate the week’s worth of events, shared that “Wellness Week is one of my favorite weeks out of the year! We get to chat with a lot of residents, have fun, and ensure they are getting connected to vital resources. This has felt especially important since returning to in-person school & programming. I feel fortunate that my job is supporting our residents and helping them feel like they belong.”

Cal Poly Pomona Foundation's (CPPF) Centerpointe Dining Commons has been recognized by the National Association of College and University Food Services (NACUFS) for the 2022 Loyal E. Horton Dining Awards.

The Loyal E. Horton Dining Award is a prestigious award that annually celebrates and recognizes exemplary campus dining services in higher education across North America.

Centerpointe was entered and placed Bronze under the "Residential Dining Concepts – Large School" category, competing with schools like Harvard University and University of Notre Dame.

Participants were required to submit a detailed book showcasing the dining facility's menu, design, marketing, nutrition, sustainability, and overall wow factor. The book included numerous images, descriptions, and examples of how Centerpointe met the judging criteria.

CPPF will be honored at the NACUFS national conference held in late July. All entries will be on display during the event and CPPF will be publicly recognized at the dining awards luncheon.

P-Cards, Receipts and Statement Reconciliation

Remember! You can use the Purchasing Card for the purchase of supplies authorized by your project only. Record all Purchasing Card activities with the proper project #, object code and description. It is mandatory to retain all vendors' receipts or documentation to comply with the Foundation and CSU, and audit requirements; and to simplify reconciliation for purchases made with the Purchasing Card. Reconciliations must be completed NO later than 5:00 p.m. on **the 25th of each month** (or the next business day if the 25th is on a weekend or holiday).

Cards may be suspended if reconciliation documents are late **any one time** in a fiscal year.

- Card privileges may be revoked with the second inappropriate purchase or first late reconciliation.
- Cards may be revoked for inappropriate use, or splitting purchases to circumvent the dollar limitation.
- Card will be terminated if the cardholder has no transactions in 6 months

As we approach June 30, our fiscal year end, we would like to remind you to forward any **vendor invoices with disbursement vouchers** to the Foundation Financial Services as soon as possible after receipt. It is very important that all expenses are booked in the year to which they apply.

As a notation, if you submit the Payment Request or Reimburse Request Web-form, you must complete it by **June 30, 2022**.

Disbursement vouchers, stipend forms, independent contractor-services invoices, travel authorization and expense report forms are due to the Foundation no later than **Friday, July 1, 2022 by 5:00pm**. Final AP check run for 2021-2022FY will be **Thursday, July 7, 2022**.

IDT's, cash receipts, request for invoices, journal entries, spreadsheets and adjustments are due to the Foundation on **Tuesday, July 5, 2022 by 5:00 pm**.

Deadlines - Grants and Contracts Projects

All disbursement vouchers and other related payment documents for supplies/equipment items purchased and received, all services performed, and all travel incurred during the period of July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022 are due to the Foundation no later than **Friday, July 1, 2022 by 5:00pm**.

Deadlines - Purchase Order Requests

Purchase Order Requests should be submitted to the Foundation Accounts Payable on **Friday, June 17, 2022 by 5:00 pm**.

Deadlines - Purchasing Cards

Purchasing card transactions for the June billing cycle (**May 10, 2022 to June 9, 2022**), which ends on **June 9, 2022** will be processed for **2021/2022 Fiscal Year**. Purchases not posted on your purchasing card by June 9, 2022 will be processed for the new 2022-2023 Fiscal Year.

This time frame allows for processing and Foundation approvals.

Internet Explorer 11 users for the purchasing cards' cardholders and approvers must switch to compatible browser to continue signing on to the CEO portal:

What's happening

You have users who have accessed the Commercial Electronic Office® (CEO®) using Internet Explorer (IE) 11 in the last 90 days.

- To avoid an interruption in CEO access, they must switch to a compatible browser by May 31.
- Microsoft is ending support for IE 11. Unsupported browsers could make your systems more vulnerable to fraudsters and malware.

What you need to do

For enhanced protection and continued CEO access, your IE 11 users must switch to one of the following compatible browsers by **May 31, 2022**:

- Chrome
- Edge*
- Firefox (Only on Windows)
- Safari (Only on Mac)

Yellow Squash

Ingredients:

- 1 lb Zucchini Spirals
- ½ lb Squash Spirals
- 1 lb Cherry Tomatoes
- ¼ cup Olive Oil
- ¼ cup Basil
- 2 Tbsp Lemon juice
- Pinch Crushed Red Pepper Flakes Kosher salt
- ¼ tsp Kosher Salt
- ¼ tsp Black pepper

1. Wash produce prior to using and dry completely
2. Using a whisk, mix the olive oil, lemon juice, basil, red pepper flakes, salt and pepper in a medium size mixing bowl until combined
3. Remove the zucchini and squash stem and spiralize according to package instructions, place into the mixing bowl
4. Gently toss all ingredients until coated with dressing
5. Chill in the refrigerator for 1 hour before service, portion into 4 bowls

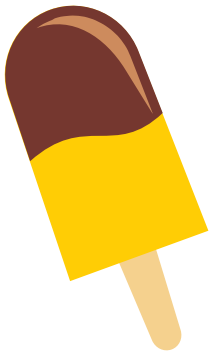
Variations: Use firm Squash, if no spiralizer, slice squashes into paper thin coins. Can also be sautéed, served warm or room temp.




